## Access Agriculture Workshop focusing on training videos and partnerships to scale natural farming across India draws over 100 participants from 23 countries

Over 100 participants representing governmental and non-governmental organisations, knowledge partners, donor agencies and media agencies, interested in natural and organic farming in India, participated in a virtual workshop on 6 April 2022. The Workshop was held under the theme "Learn & Earn from Natural Farming Videos — Access Agriculture: Expanding Opportunities for Farmers, Women & Youth." It was jointly organised by the National Institute of Agricultural Extension Management

(MANAGE), the <u>National Coalition for Natural Farming</u> (NF Coalition), and <u>Access</u> <u>Agriculture</u>.

#### Soya sowing density

To achieve the best density of soya bean plants in our field, we must take four precautions: 1. Use seeds that grow well; 2. Narrow the space between seedling rows and between holes; 3. Do not step on the planting holes of the field; and 4. Control the rodents that eat seeds and seedlings after sowing.

#### Calcium deficiency in dairy cows

Calcium deficiency is common among high-yielding dairy cows. A calcium deficient cow does not eat much, is cold to touch. looks tired and is unable to stand up. She gives less milk. Untreated cows may die. To prevent calcium deficiency, do not dehorn your cows. Let the cows have some sun in the cool hours, so they will produce vitamin D and absorb more calcium. Feed the cows with legume fodders, maize fodder and tree leaves that are rich in calcium. Give them a mineral mixture in either the drinking water or feed. After milking, give each cow a basket full of green grass. The video contains many other practical tips. English | French | Kannada | Tamil

# FROM OUR CHANGEMAKERS

## ERAs@work!

The following <u>Entrepreneurs for Rural Access</u> (ERAs) are part of the Access Agriculture project under the <u>Green Innovation Centres for the Agriculture and Food Sector</u> (GIC)-Mali initiative supported by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (<u>BMZ</u>):

- ERA from Mali, Aliou Maiga, who is passionate about organic agriculture, conducted a series of video screenings to train 80 farmers, including 77 women, to enhance their learning on food processing. The videos shown included <u>Making</u> <u>mango crisps</u>, <u>Storing fresh and dried tomatoes</u>, and <u>Tomato concentrate and</u> juice. (See photos in Access Agriculture Flickr album)
- ERA from Mali, **Rokiatou Traoré**, Co-founder and CEO of Hérou Alliance enterprise organised a Facebook Live discussion with five moringa experts from Africa and elsewhere on the uses of Moringa, a plant with high nutritional and medicinal value. Watch the discussion here.

The following ERAs are part of the Access Agriculture project under the <u>Knowledge</u> <u>Centre for Organic Agriculture in Africa</u> (KCOA), funded by BMZ and implemented by GIZ:

- ERA from Uganda, Rebecca Akullu, Co-Director of the Adyaka Rural Youth Development Initiative (ARYODI), which runs the Aryodi Bee Farm in Lira, Uganda, conducted a 2-day video-screening sessions on demand from 103 farmers (including 74 women farmers), interested in beekeeping. The videos included: <u>Turning honey into money</u>, <u>Making a modern beehive</u>, <u>Enriching</u> porridge with baobab juice and <u>Using sack mounds to grow vegetables</u>. - ERA from Uganda, **Canary Ahabwe**, Founder & Managing Director of Agromush-Uganda, which focuses on mushroom production and packaging, showed the video on <u>Growing oyster mushrooms</u> to 25 youths (50% female) at Rwentanga Farm Institute in Mbarara District, Uganda. - ERA from Kenya, Elphas Masanga, Farmer Trainer in biodiversity conservation at Slow Food Kenya and Coordinator for Slow Food Youth Network in Kenya, conducted a video-led training for a farmers group from Kahua-ini, Nakuru County, Kenya. The farmer training videos comprised (1) <u>Good microbes for</u> <u>plants and soil</u> (2) <u>Organic biofertilizer in liquid and solid form</u>. After watching the videos, the farmers participated in a practical session on making the good microbes for soil by themselves. (See photos in Access Agriculture Facebook)
- ERA from Tanzania, **James Gamba Nyaonge**, district youth representative in the Tanzania Teachers Union (TTU), showed the video on <u>Cassava mosaic</u> <u>virus</u> to 46 farmers, including 9 women, in Sengerema District of the Mwanza Region of Tanzania.
- ERA from Uganda, **Azaria Kamusiime**, a member of the AgroMush Uganda enterprise in Mbarara district in Western Uganda, screened video on <u>Using sack</u> <u>mounds to grow vegetables</u> to eight young women farmers in Sheema Municipality, in the Western Region of Uganda. - ERA from Zambia, **Sussana Phiri**, who is a young farmer passionate about agriculture and scaling up of food and nutrition security, conducted two video screening shows (the first one for 20 farmers including 17 women in Mt. Makulu, Lusaka, and the second one for 33 farmers, including 31 women, in Mwa Mwandu, Chipapa, Zambia. The videos included <u>Recording the weather</u>, <u>Village savings and loan associations</u>.
- ERA from Mali, **Mamadou Diarra**, cofounder of an enterprise called Expert Elevage Consulting, did a series of training in fish farming for 10 farmers. The videos shown included <u>Stocking fingerlings in a nursery pond</u> (<u>See photos in</u> <u>Access Agriculture Flickr album</u>)

## Reaping benefits of digital extension

The first cases of COVID-19 were confirmed in Malawi in early April 2020, and the numbers went up subsequently, leading to Government-instituted COVID-19 lockdowns, which disrupted almost all aspects of normal life in the country.

One of the most affected sectors by the lockdowns was agriculture, as contacts between extension workers and farmers were drastically reduced. This aggravated farmers' problems, as even in pre-COVID times, the ratio of extension workers to farmers was already lower than it should have been.
