Access Agriculture set to equip young entrepreneurs and partners with innovative e-learning technology in Hyderabad under the aegis of MANAGE

Access Agriculture will kick off its programme on equipping selected young agrient entrepreneurs and key partners with an innovative e-learning technology and related skills, 23-25 January 2023, in Hyderabad, Telangana, India.

The Director General of the National Institute of Agricultural Extension Management (MANAGE), Dr. P. Chandra Shekara, has graciously accepted to host this event under the aegis of MANAGE. He will inaugurate the Partners' Event of the Access Agriculture programme on 25th January and deliver the keynote address.

The e-learning technology that will be distributed by Access Agriculture at this event consists of a portable smart projector kit that contains Access Agriculture's entire multimedia knowledge resource – with over 3000 high quality farmer-training videos and audio files across 95 languages. It can be used to train farmers even in offline and off-grid environments.

The Access Agriculture training programme in MANAGE will equip and upgrade the skills of seven ERA teams (consisting of 18 individual ERAs, including 9 dynamic young women), who were selected based on a call for proposals that laid a special emphasis on young women entrepreneurs.

ERAs@work!

The following Entrepreneurs for Rural Access (ERAs) are part of the Access Agriculture project under the Knowledge Centre for Organic Agriculture in Africa (KCOA), funded by BMZ and implemented by GIZ:

- ERA from Kenya, Christopher Mwazighe, Founder and Project Manager at Inuabiz Kenya, a community-based organisation that trains youth to start and manage enterprises, visited homes of farming families in Nyolo Village in Taita Taveta, Kenya, to facilitate video screening of SLM12 Conservation agriculture to 20 young farmers, including six women. - ERA from Uganda, Martha Kyokuhaire, Founder and CEO of VFL Gardens. Mukono, Uganda, visited several villages disseminating knowledge on agroecological practices through the screening of 12 videos: SLM12 Conservation agriculture, Using sack mounds to grow vegetables, Enriching porridge, Managing aflatoxins in maize during drying and storage, Storing fresh and dried tomatoes, Mulch for a better soil and crop, Staggering production of tomatoes, Managing aphids in beans and vegetables, The wonder of earthworms, Staking tomato plants, Making a cooling chamber for tomatoes and Water users associations. - ERA from Mali, Mamadou Diarra, who is passionate about farming and livestock, and is the co-founder of an enterprise called Expert Élevage Consulting (EEC SARL), conducted a training course, 27-29 December 2022, mainly on dried meat for 45 participants, including 11 young women of Père Michel Centre of Niaréla, Bamako, Mali. At the same time, Mamadou took the opportunity to show to them two training videos on food processing: Making mango crisps and Tomato concentrate and juice. At the end of the training, participants received a certificate from Père Michel Centre.

The following ERAs are part of the Access Agriculture project in India supported by the Kristian Gerhard Jebsen Foundation (KGJF):

ERAs from India belonging to Susag Millet Farmer Producer Company (FPC), commonly known as 'Millet Sisters,' comprising Indira Karri, Santhi Kumari Tuburu and Dasari Dali Naidu, participated in a Farmers' Fair in Vizianagaram district in Andhra Pradesh. As part of this fair, indigenous farmers received seed of millet, maize and sesame.


Teaching the teachers
