

ERAs@work!

The following Entrepreneurs for Rural Access (ERAs) are part of the Access Agriculture project under the Knowledge Centre for Organic Agriculture in Africa (KCOA), funded by BMZ and implemented by GIZ:

- ERAs from Uganda, Adriko Simon Negro, Canary Ahabwe, Rebecca Akullu, and Teddy Nabwire, accompanied by Access Agriculture Entrepreneur Coach Co-ordinator, Jane Nalunga, and Access Agriculture Entrepreneur Coach for East Africa, Ezra Masolaki, participated in an event themed "Transforming and training farmers using translated farmer to farmer videos," in Makerere University College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences, Kampala, Uganda. The event was organised in collaboration with the Farmer's Media, which is founded by Accessa Agriculture Ambassador, Grace Musimami. The other coorganisers were the Northern Uganda Agriculture Shows (NUAS), the Alliance For Farmer Development (AFAD), Uganda Forum for Agricultural Advisory Services (UFAAS) and the School of Agricultural Sciences, Makerere University. The ERAs shared their experiences in using videos to promote agroecological practices in the farming communities. (See photos in Access Agriculture Facebook)
- ERA from Zambia, Sussana Phiri, who is interested in food and nutrition security
 of young mothers, facilitated a video show session at Mt. Makulu Clinic in Lusaka,
 Zambia for 53 participants, including 47 young women and 6 men. The videos
 shown included Making mango crisps and Making cassava snacks in Chewa

- ERA from Malawi, Sydney Jassi, who is passionate about training farmers through videos in local languages spoken in Malawi, facilitated the screening of two videos for 62 participants, including 39 women and 23 men in Nalikule village, Lilongwe. The videos included <u>Human urine as fertilizer</u> and <u>Organic biofertilizer</u> in liquid and solid form. (See photos in Access Agriculture Facebook)
- ERA from Uganda, Canary Ahabwe, Founder & Managing Director of Agromush-Uganda, which focuses on mushroom production and packaging, conducted a training session using the video <u>Using sack mounds to grow vegetables</u> for 13 participants (11 women and 2 men) in Kamukuzi Division, western Uganda. - ERA from Uganda, Martha Kyokuhaire, Founder and CEO of VFL Gardens. Mukono, Uganda, facilitated two video shows. The first one held on 22 January involved the screening of the video on Managing aflatoxins in maize during drying and storage was targeted to 20 farmers, including 17 women and three men, in Mparangasi village, Hoima District, Uganda. In the second programme held on 29 January, Martha facilitated the screening of two videos Managing aphids in beans and vegetables and Enriching porridge with baobab juice for 17 farmers,

including 13 women and 4 men in in Mparangasi village, Hoima District, Uganda. (See photos in Access Agriculture Facebook)

ERAs from India, belonging to seven ERA teams from Andhra Pradesh and Telangana States – Jasmin, Bhairav Kumar, Ramannamma, Gemmeli Thoudanna, Midathana Hemalatha, Vanthala Matsyaraju, Pangi Lakshmi, Salla Venkata Lakshmi, Anuradha, Sandeep, D D Naidu, Thuburu Shanti, Karri Indira, Bobbili Syamala, Bobbili Janaki, Kommu Eswara Rao, Budda Anuradha and Pothula Buggappa, actively participated in a 2-day hands-on training programme in MANAGE, Hyderabad, India, on the use of the smart projector to facilitate farmer-training video shows in villages. As part of their practical session, on the 3rd day, the ERAs were asked to impart the same training to Access Agriculture partners, which they successfully achieved. The ERAs also learnt about the MergData app for monitoring and reporting of the video screenings. The resource persons included Access Agriculture Entrepreneur coaches for India (Nandini Pakki and Mounica Lingireddy) Neeraj Kumar (Khetee) and Nafissath Fousseni Barres, supported by Phil Malone, and S Kannappan.

Making farmers anonymous

Short food chains narrow the gap between producers and consumers, but when food is traded through wholesalers and when supermarkets sell their own brands, active efforts are undertaken to make farmers anonymous.

This never really occurred to me until Vera Kuijpers, from the organic farm and farm shop Het Eikelenhof in north-eastern Limburg, told me about her latest experience with Biofresh, one of the major organic wholesalers in Belgium.
